Class Concepts:

1. Divorce is a change in a family, not an end to the family.
2. Children's ages and needs are the first consideration in making family decisions.
3. The family lifestyle as the child sees and experiences it impacts adjustment.
4. Ages and stages in a child's development determine appropriate parenting activities, explanations and family lifestyles that meet children's emotional, educational, social, physical and spiritual needs.
5. Co-parenting is a lifelong process.
6. Stress, change stages of divorce and stages of grief impact children and families. Good management techniques strengthen children and the family.
7. Children and families need continuing services.
